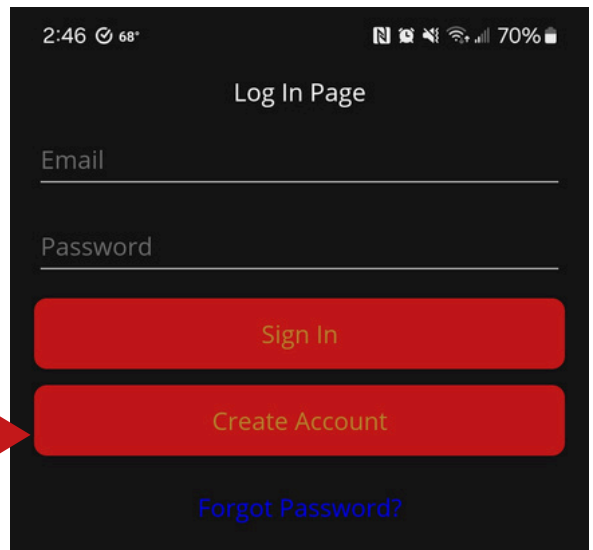
Step 1: Download the Fish Battle App

Go to the app store on your phone and download the Fish Battle App.



Step 2 Create your Fish Battle Account

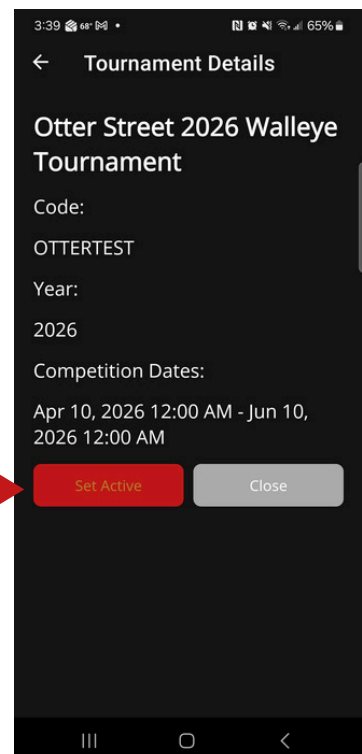
- Click **Create an Account**
 - Use the same email address you used on the registration form
 - Use a password that you will remember



Step 3: Allow Fish Battle App to use your camera for photos/video

Step 4: Choose your battle

- Select the **Otter Street 2026 Walleye Tournament**
 - Set to Active
 - Allow the app to take photos/video if asked again

Fish Battle App usage

Using the Camera

- **Step 1:** Take bump board photo (up to 5)
- **Step 2:** Select Next
- **Step 3:** Take hero shot photo (up to 5)
- **Step 4:** Select Finalize
- **Step 5:** Select the Length in inches from the drop down then decimals in the drop down (note: at this time you can review any of your pictures for glare and verify that you entered your lengths correctly)
- **Step 6:** Once you are happy with your pictures and length data select **Submit and return to fishing**



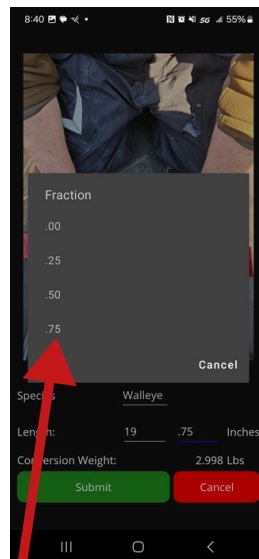

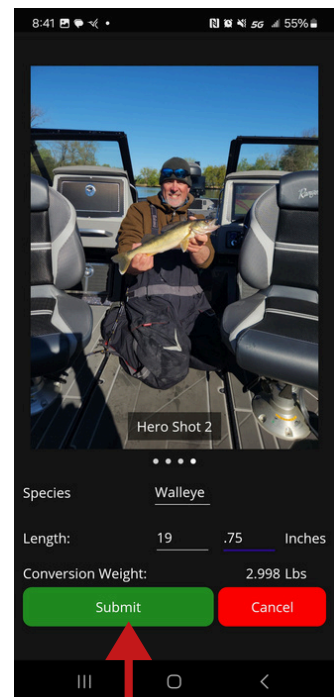

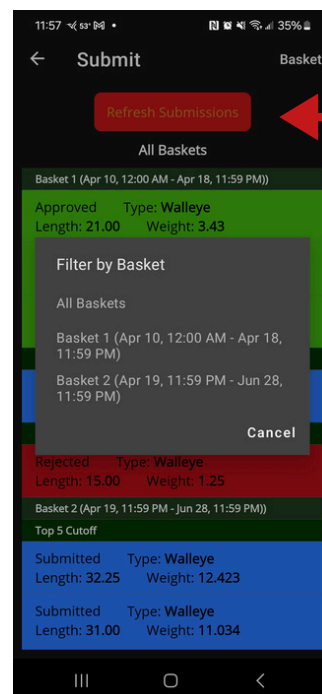

Fish Battle App usage

• Submissions

- Submissions default to the tournament day you are currently fishing
- Submissions color scheme
 - **Blue**=submitted
 - **Green**=approve
 - **Green with yellow text**=submission corrected by judge
 - **Red**=rejected by judge
- To review previous submissions select basket and chose the day 1 basket and or select "All Baskets"
- To update your submissions just refresh your submissions at any time.
- You must have **Cell SIGNAL** for images to send to the database. Don't panic, all images will send as soon as you reenter cell service.



acceptable bump board measuring

An Angler's Guide to the OSFC/BOB Catch-Record-Release (CRR) Walleye Tournament



There is only one acceptable way to hold the fish on bump board. Bump of board to your left, nose of fish to the left, and belly of fish toward you (belly to belly). **Any other way will be a disqualified fish.** See the gallery below for visual examples of what to do and what to avoid.



Fish Correct Example:

You can clearly see the lip of the fish touching the bump board to the left, fish's belly toward the angler (belly to belly) and clearly see the tail touching 18.25" – this fish will score 18-1/2" on the score card. If the fish's tail brushed a line, you round up to the next line mark for official score on card.

There is only one acceptable way to hold the fish on bump board. Bump of board to your left, nose of fish to the left, and belly of fish toward you (belly to belly). **Any other way will be a disqualified fish.** See the gallery below for visual examples of what to do and what to avoid.

~~X~~ Cannot See Tail Example:

Cannot see the tail under the hand. This fish would be disqualified.



~~X~~ Cannot See Head Example:

Cannot see the head of the fish under the hand. This fish would be disqualified.



acceptable bump board measuring

It is expected anglers review the rules and photo examples and we **strongly recommend** you follow Otter Street and Battle on Bago on Facebook to keep up with all updates



Fish Upside Down Example:

Fish belly is away from the angler. This fish would be disqualified.



Fish Backwards Example:

The tail is left. This fish would be disqualified.



frequently asked questions

What happens if we lose our bump board?

You will be charged \$50. You will then receive a temporary replacement, to be turned in after the tournament concludes.

How do we know how to use the bump boards compliantly?

Review the the entirety of this guide for clear, visual instructions on use, and to access all angler resources, including the tournament rules. These should clear up any questions on acceptable use. This will be reviewed during the rules meeting, and as always with specific questions – reach out to one of the Tournament Directors.

What do I need to turn in at the end of the tournament?

- OSFC/BOB Bump Board

What happens if our phone doesn't work or dies?

Coming into tournament weekend...please be sure your battery is charged. If its low after Day 1, charge it so it's ready for Day 2. BUT, if that should happen, make sure your partner is able to download the Fish Battle App

What if we 0.00 on Day 1?

We wish you better luck on Day 2!

If you will not be fishing on Day 2, you also must return the bump board.

score card & conversion chart

Your score card is your digital basket in the Fish Battle App. The conversion chart is the same as it always has been down to the thousandth and is built directly into the Fish Battle App. Select the length to the 1/4th inch which will auto populate the weight conversion for you. Your top 5 fish will count!

important tips & reminders

- Anglers must use their own phone, download the Fish Battle app to submit photos for judging
- The CRR format is important to our organizations as it prioritizes conservation, while still putting on a competitive and fun event. If you'd like more information or have questions, please contact one of our tournament directors. We are committed to helping you understand your role and responsibilities.
- Fish Registration will END at the end of your flight on June 20th and 21st.
- As always, the rules meeting is mandatory. One team member MUST attend, 6pm at tournament headquarters. Review all tournament rules (located within your application and/or on our website). It is your obligation to understand the rules and ask questions should you need clarification.

Why CRR?

CRR stands for Catch-Record-Release, which essentially means that when a fish gets caught, they are measured, recorded for the angler's tournament weigh ins and released immediately....dramatically reducing the kill rate of the fish, while still providing a fun and competitive tournament.

Every angler that fishes the tournament pays a conservation fee that is added to their entry fee.

Conservation is of utmost importance to our organization, so in 2021 we were proud to champion the CRR format. 2022 followed suit, and this year's event is no different. We're excited to host 350 teams as you battle it out for the money and status!
